Speakers

Professor Peter Scott is a Professor of International Business History at University of Reading Business School as well as the Director of the Centre for International Business History, and a trustee of the Business Archives Council (BAC). He was awarded his DPhil from Oxford University and has ever since written extensively on issues of British economic and business history on issues relating to a large array of subjects, including the growth of mass consumption and the effects of government policy to businesses. He has recently published *Triumph of the South: A Regional Economic History of Britain during the Early Twentieth Century* (Aldershot: Ashgate, 2007) focusing on the dynamic metropolitan economy of Greater London as a prime determinant of Britain's uneven regional development since the mid-nineteenth century.

Dr. Valerie Johnson is a qualified archivist, with experience in business archives, who has subsequently moved into historical research. She is currently working as a Research Officer for the BP History Project, based at the University of Cambridge.
